Dates: August 6—8 Time: 9 am—12 pm

Location: Independence Grove, North Bay Pavilion

What to wear: Sturdy closed toe shoes, clothing that is appropriate for the weather, movement, and

exploration.

What to bring: Water bottle, snack, sunscreen, and bug spray. Hat and sunglasses encouraged.

Tuesday, August 6

Scales, Scutes & Skin

Reptiles, amphibians, and fish are today's emphasis. Participants learn the differences between these animal groups and get an up close and personal look at some of their coverings as they'll meet a few of our live education animals.

Wednesday, August 7

Exoskeletons

Exoskeletons cover the arthropod group which includes insects, spiders, and crustaceans. Campers search for crawling critters on a hike and discover those that live in an aquatic environment while dip netting.

Participants may get wet or muddy today. Please bring rubber boots (or an extra pair of shoes).

Thursday, August 8

Feathers & Fur

Participants learn about the adaptations of birds and mammals, go on a walk looking for animal signs and discover how their coverings help them survive. They may even have a chance to meet a live feathered visitor.
