Monday

Campers will be able to:

- name five fish in Independence Grove and the best methods for catching them.
- get acquainted and comfortable with equipment, fishing, and each other.
- define why we catch and release.
- practice casting skills.
- observe how to remove a hook from fish.
- identify criteria for choosing good fishing spots.

Tuesday

Campers will be able to:

- identify five parts of rod and reel.
- rig a pole and learn about common tackle.
- better understand a wetland food web.
- improve fishing skils, including baiting their own hook with worm or minnow.

Wednesday

Campers will be able to:

- play a casting game to improve skill.
- tie a Snell knot.
- hone their casting skills.
- spool line onto a closed-face reel.

Thursday

Campers will be able to:

- rig and use a Texas-rigged rubber worm.
- make drop-shot rigs.
- observe proper way to use bass plugs and lures.

Friday

Campers will be able to:

- make a catfish rig.
- tie a fisherman's knot.
- take a hook out of at least one fish's mouth.
