#### 6.0 CORRESPONDENCE

### 6.1 <u>Letter from Village of Third Lake regarding assistance with paved trail access to the Rollins Savanna Forest Preserve trail system</u>

Director Seebach presented a written request from the Village of Third Lake for the District's assistance to expand the Rollins Savanna trail system by paving the dirt trail that is being used by Village residents to access the preserve. The Village's Board of Directors has committed \$30,000 to offset the estimated cost of \$75,000 for the Lake Avenue connection.

Discussion ensued and included comments from the Village Mayor, Mr. Gary Beggan. It was explained that the District has already made decisions regarding which capital projects would be funded for the upcoming fiscal year, and that no funds would be committed toward the trail connection at this time. Mr. Beggan was asked if the Village's board might be willing to reserve the \$30,000 for the District to consider the project for its 2017/2018 fiscal year. Mr. Beggan responded that he would take the suggestion back to the members of his board.



#### 7.0 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR COMMENTS

Executive Director Kovach presented an update of District projects, news and upcoming events including:

- The Preservation Foundation's estimate of known estate gifts totals \$7.5 million, an application has been submitted to the Illinois Coastal Management Program for a \$48,000 grant to conduct Blanding's Turtle monitoring at Illinois Beach State Park as part of the management of state-endangered species throughout the Chiwaukee Illinois Beach Lake Plain, and the District has received a \$100,000 commitment for a donation toward the District's pilot buckthorn removal project.
- A reminder that the remainder of the First Folio event is scheduled for Tuesday, February 2<sup>nd</sup> from 6-8 p.m. at the Discovery Museum.
- The District's Leadership Team recently met to identify endowment and project opportunities for the Preservation Foundation.
- An all-staff meeting convened to focus on the core value of Communication, leaving training of the final value of Collaboration before proceeding into the maintenance and development of the District's five core values.
- Greenbelt Cultural Center will be the site of the *Annual Volunteer Recognition* event on Saturday, February 27 at 10:30 a.m., and *Profiles for Excellence* on Sunday, February 7 at 3:00 p.m.
- Staff performed due diligence in the interest of securing a future home for the Curt Teich Postcard Collection and visited the Newberry Library in Chicago and anticipates making a recommendation in March.
- A meeting between President Maine and the District legislative consultant on January 20 revealed that the 10% reduction in the State Replacement Tax as at the appropriate level, a future property tax freeze is likely, as is a continued State budget stalemate for the immediate future.
- There will be a Joint Legislative Committee breakfast at the Lake Bluff Park District on February 26 at 8:30 a.m. Interested parties were requested to RSVP to Mr. Kovach.
