Before the Civil War, Mary Ann Bickerdyke, a widow from Galesburg, Illinois, struggled with her family to survive. During the War, she became one of the Union Army's most trusted and beloved nurses and hospital administrators. This presentation will give you an insight into the driving force that kept this feisty woman with the Union Army until the end of the war and was called among other things, "The woman that outranked General Sherman."

#### A Recipe for Success: Lizzie Kander and the Settlement Cookbook

First published in 1901, Kander's *The Settlement Cookbook: The Way to a Man's Heart* taught thousands of young immigrant girls how to cook "American-style." It became one of the most successful fundraising cookbooks in history, and the proceeds helped build Milwaukee's first settlement house and later the Jewish Community Center. Join Bob as he shares stories about Lizzie, her cookbook, and life in Milwaukee during the late 19th and early 20th century.
