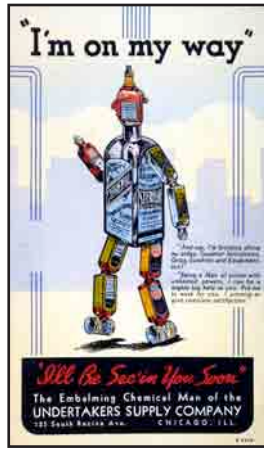

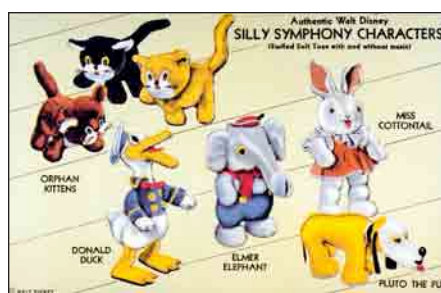

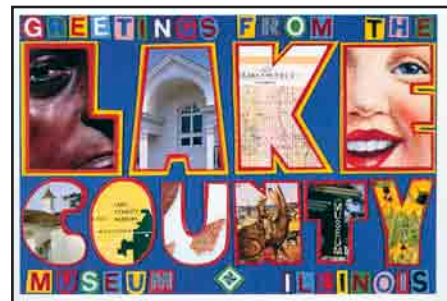

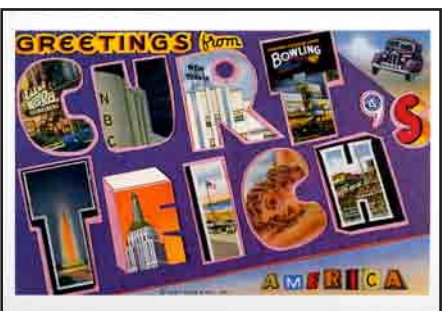

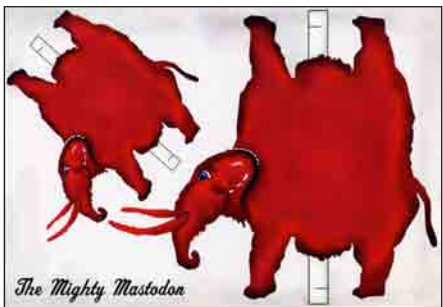

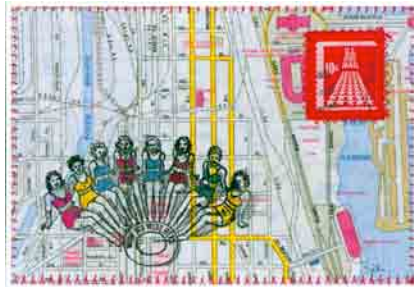

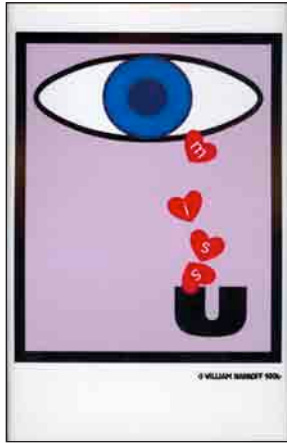

The boardwalks, beachside ballrooms, and people on promenade in *Down by the Seaside*, show the exotic and just plain fun structures that enhanced beachgoers' sense of fantasy and escape. Vacationers throng the beaches and boardwalks from Atlantic City and Wildwood, NJ to Daytona Beach, FL, Sandusky, OH, Long Beach, and Catalina Island, CA.

Built to Amuse: Views from America's Past

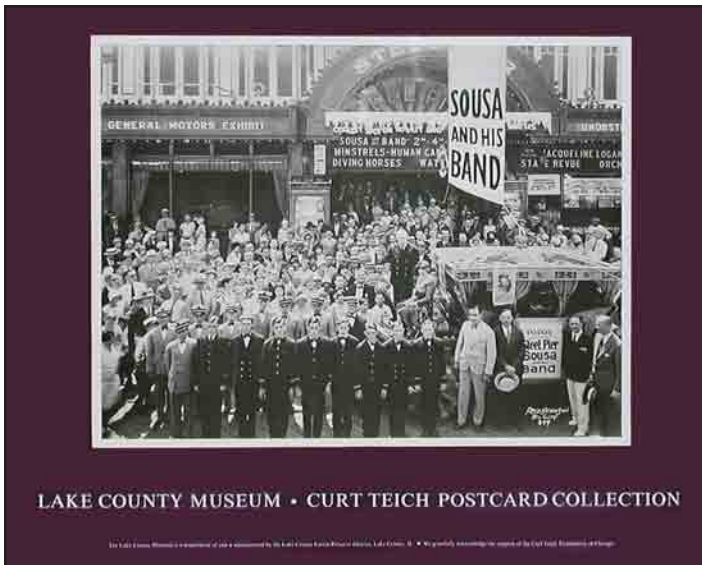

Mostly Moderne: Views from America's Past

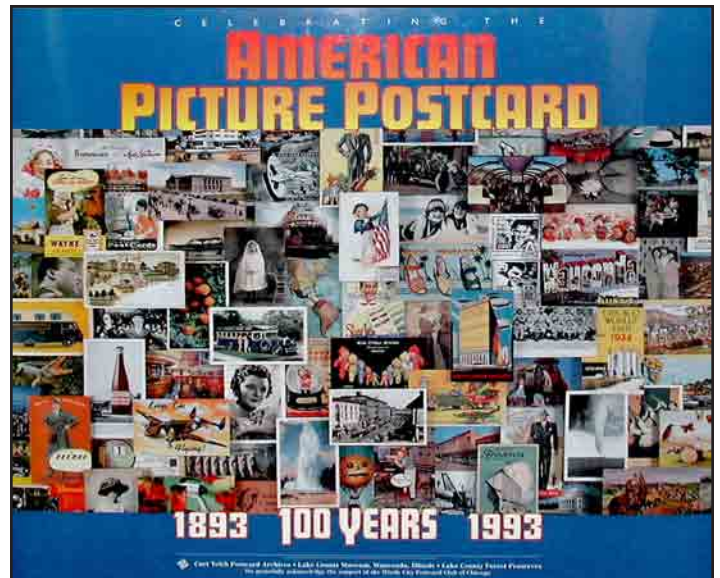
