## EQUESTRIAN TRAIL USE RULES AND REGULATIONS

The holder of this permit is subject to the rules and regulations of the Lake County Forest Preserve District. Permits may be revoked and/or fines charged for non-adherence to rules.

1. Each permitted horse shall be equipped with a permission tag that is securely attached to upper left bridle or halter.
2. It shall be unlawful within the Forest Preserves for any person:
  - a. to treat a horse cruelly or knowingly permit such treatment
  - b. to ride or lead a horse that is vicious, unmanageable or physically unfit for riding
  - c. to ride a horse in such a manner as to injure or endanger the person or property of the Forest Preserve District
  - d. to ride a horse that is not adequately and safely equipped for riding
  - e. to possess or consume alcoholic beverages on any bridge trail
  - f. to change horses on the trail
  - g. to race horses. Horses must be kept under control and ridden at permitted gaits: walk, trot or slow canter.
3. Rider shall stay on established trails and slow to a walk upon meeting other riders or hikers.

### PERMIT INSTRUCTIONS

Display bridle tag at all times while on Lake County Forest Preserve trails.

A \$2 fee will be charged for the replacement of lost bridle tag. Available by phone 847-367-6640 or during regular weekday business hours at the Lake County Forest Preserve General Offices in Libertyville, or in person at the Operations Office, 19808 W. Grand Ave., Lindenhurst from 6 a.m. – 3 p.m., weekdays.
