DOG EXERCISE AREA AGREEMENT AND RULES

When you submit this application and pay the fee you will receive a temporary pass that will serve as a pass **for the registered license plate numbers(s) until your dog park vehicle sticker(s) arrives**. The temporary pass is valid only for a limited time after the date of issue. If your sticker does not arrive by mail within two weeks of your application, please call our General Offices, 847-367-6640.

When your sticker arrives, affix it to the upper corner of the passenger side of your front windshield below any tint or shading. Stickers are non-transferable. Replacement stickers are available to current permit holders for a \$2 fee from our General Offices.

Permit Agreement: For everyone's safety and enjoyment, you and your dog are required to adhere to the following rules while visiting the Lake County Forest Preserve Dog Exercise Areas. If complaints are registered for aggressive behavior of your dog or non-adherence to rules, your permit may be revoked and/or fines charged. Incidents are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Permit Rules:

1. Access to the Dog Area is limited to registered annual and daily permit holders. The dog permit vehicle sticker must be displayed on the right hand corner of the passenger-side windshield below the tinted area. Stickers are non-transferable.

This application does not serve as a valid permit.

2. Dogs must be at least four months old to visit the Dog Areas AND have a current rabies vaccination tag number. If your dog's vaccination is not current, which is required by state law, please call your vet. Consult with your vet regarding other recommended vaccinations or preventives. Dogs that are ill will not be allowed in the Dog Areas.

3. Dogs must be leashed while in the parking lots and walkways. Please close the fence gate behind you after entering the off-leash area.

4. No more than three dogs per person are allowed in the area during any one visit.

5. Fishing, bikes, horses, cats, game animals or birds, firearms, boats, food, dog chews and rawhide are not allowed in the Dog Areas.

6. The Dog Areas may be used for dog exercise, obedience, tracking, retrieving and pointing training.

7. No fishing or swimming by humans allowed.

8. Children visiting the Dog Areas must be accompanied by an adult and are expected to behave appropriately.

9. Do not run or chase after dogs, and never attempt to pet other dogs unless permission is granted by that dog's owner.

10. You must remain on-site with your dog and closely supervise your dog at all times. You are solely responsible for controlling your dog. You must maintain visual contact and voice control of your dog. If aggressive behavior is observed, you must leash your dog and remove it from the Dog Area. You are responsible for any injury or damage to other dogs or the public caused by your dog. Dog Area participation is at your own risk.

11. You must pick up after your dog and do your part to keep the Dog Area clean and sanitary. Failure to pick up after your dog could result in a \$75 fine. Pick up bags and trash cans are available at each Dog Area.

Ordinance violations & fineable offenses

- Responsible to pick up after pet(s)
- Must be in control of dog(s) at all times
- Will be responsible for any injury or damage to other dogs or the public caused by your dog
