Figure out how many steps it would have taken you to walk from Cincinnati, Ohio to Chicago, Illinois.


1. Measure one of your normal steps from front heel to back heel. How many inches is it?



2. Divide 63360 (the number of inches in a mile) by that number.

Now you have figured the number of steps in a mile.

3. Multiply the number of steps by 300 miles - the distance between Cincinnati and Chicago.



The answer is the number of steps it would have taken you to walk from Cincinnati to Chicago.
