DOG EXERCISE AREA AGREEMENT AND RULES

When you submit this application and pay the fee you will receive a temporary pass via email that will serve as a pass **for the registered license plate number(s) until your dog park vehicle sticker(s) arrives**. The temporary pass is valid only for a limited time after the date of issue. If your sticker does not arrive by mail within two weeks of your application, please call our General Offices, 847-367-6640.

When your sticker arrives, affix it to the upper corner of the passenger side of your front windshield below any tint or shading. Stickers are non-transferable. Replacement stickers are available to current permit holders for a \$5 fee from our General Offices 1899 West Winchester Road, Libertyville from 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m, the Operations and Public Safety Facility 19808 W. Grand Avenue, Lindenhurst from 6:30 a.m. - 3 p.m., and at Edward L. Ryerson Welcome Center 21950 North Riverwoods Road, Riverwoods, 9 a.m - 5 p.m. Tuesday - Saturday and 11 a.m. - 4 p.m. Sundays.

Permit Agreement: For everyone's safety and enjoyment, you and your dog are required to adhere to the following rules while visiting the Lake County Forest Preserve Dog Exercise Areas. If complaints are registered for aggressive behavior of your dog or non-adherence to rules, your permit may be revoked and/or fines charged. Incidents are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Permit Rules:

1. Permit and dog are required for entry. Use at your own risk. Display vehicle sticker on your car's windshield below the tinted area. Stickers are not transferable. Replacement stickers can be purchased by current annual permit holders.
2. Park in lots only. Loitering in lots is prohibited. Vehicles left after closing will be towed at owner's expense.
3. Keep your dog leashed while in parking lots, walkways and unfenced areas. Close the fence gate behind you after entering the area.
4. No more than three dogs per person are allowed during any one visit.
5. Approved canine activities include swimming, dog exercise, retrieving, tracking, pointing and obedience training.
6. Alcoholic beverages, food, dog toys, treats, chews and rawhide are not permitted.
7. Horses, cats, other pets, game animals or birds are not permitted.
8. Bikes, boats, swimming, fishing, ice fishing, snowmobiles, camping, fires, collecting, hunting, firearms, releasing animals or non-native plant species, and off-road or motorized vehicles are not permitted.
9. Children must be accompanied by an adult and are expected to behave appropriately. Do not run or chase after dogs, and never attempt to pet other dogs unless permission is granted by that dog's owner.
10. You must remain in the Dog Area with your dog and closely supervise your dog at all times. You are solely responsible for controlling your dog. You must maintain visual contact and voice control of your dog. If aggressive behavior is observed, you must leash your dog and remove it from the area. You are responsible for any injury or damage to other dogs or the public caused by your dog.
11. Clean up after your dog. Bags provided. Deposit bags and all other litter in proper receptacles. Failure to pick up after your dog could result in an \$85 fine.
12. Violation of rules, regulations or restrictions may result in a fine and/or suspension of permit use.

Ordinance violations & fineable offenses

- Responsible to pick up after pet(s)
- Must be in control of dog(s) at all times
- Will be responsible for any injury or damage to other dogs or the public caused by your dog
