# **Monday**

What dinosaurs roamed Lake County?

65 million years ago dinosaurs roamed through Lake County. But what did those dinosaurs actually look like? Campers will work with the fossil record and scientific evidence to reconstruct their own version of the dinosaur dryptosaurus.

### **Tuesday**

What is an archaeologist? What questions do archaeologists want answered?

Native American artifacts have been found at Lakewood! But which period of history did they come from? Campers will explore this question as they participate in a mock archaeological dig and interpret the artifacts they uncover.

# Wednesday

Who deserves the credit for the invention of the telephone?

Today, the detectives will investigate the controversy over who deserves credit for the invention of the telephone, Alexander Graham Bell or Lake County resident Elisha Gray. By looking at the patent applications and performing experiments on sound, campers will come up with their decision.

# **Thursday**

Did the Underground Railroad pass through Lake County?

Campers will analyze this question as they learn about the abolitionist movement in Lake County. They weigh evidence such as secret codes, documents such as maps and church statements, and celestial navigation.

#### Friday

*How accurate is historical fiction?* 

After reading passages from historical fiction books, campers will determine how accurate the stories are by looking at primary and secondary sources. They will look at both real and fictional people, places, and events to compare and contrast fact and fiction.
