### **Teacher Ambassador Program**

The Lake County Forest Preserves (LCFPD) and Dunn Museum Teacher Ambassador Program provides a unique opportunity for Lake County K-12 educators to connect with history and environmental education-based resources and staff. #### Through the Teacher Ambassador Program, educators will:

- Help to pilot and shape a brand-new program.
- Become ambassadors for the Forest Preserves and Dunn Museum back at their school, helping to build and strengthen connections and foster larger educational opportunities.
- Become a voice for the needs of students and teachers of Lake County to the Forest Preserves and Dunn Museum in order to continue to create new, and improve existing, learning opportunities.
- Connect with their peers and create a learning community that can be utilized outside of the program itself, for continued professional development and support.
- Earn Professional Development Training Credits.
- Further develop skills in object-based and inquiry-based teaching and learning.
- Utilize Museum resources and collections, and learn how to incorporate them in the classroom.
- Learn more about existing educational opportunities for teachers and students offered by the Forest Preserves and Dunn Museum.
- Participate in a minimum of **3 of 5 sessions** on a variety of topics incorporating local history and fostering connections between the Museum and the classroom, including a **mandatory orientation** training session at the annual Dunn Museum Teacher Open House.
- Create a culminating project.
