Lake County Forest Preserves Legislative Committee Meeting Minutes July 25, 2023

The Lake County Forest Preserves Special Legislative Committee met on Tuesday, July 25, 2023. The meeting was held at Independence Grove Forest Preserve, Visitors Center, 16400 West Buckley Road, Libertyville, Illinois.

- 3.0 Pledge of Allegiance Chair Hart led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 4.0 Addenda to the Agenda None
- **5.0** Approval Minutes Motion by Vice Chair Roberts, second by Pedersen to approve minutes from May 1, 2023. Voice vote being had, the motion passed unanimously. The minutes were circulated for signatures.

- 9.0 New Business
 - 9.1 Presentation and Discussion on a Potential 2024 Capital Referendum. Rebekah Snyder, Director of Community Engagement and Partnerships, gave a presentation explaining that in June 2023 the District's board of commissioners directed staff to place a question on the ballot for November 2024 for a capital referendum to support projects and land acquisition at the forest preserves. She noted the District is still facing operating challenges. That the District is down 29 positions since 2009. The 10-year operating budget projection indicates expenses will exceed revenues in six years without any new funding.

The presentation outlined the high-level referendum goals of equitable distribution of resources across the county; reduced operating costs; complete what we've started; take care of what we have; improve ecosystem services to support quality of life in Lake County; and support the District's Long Range Strategic Plan.

Using maps, Director Snyder provided examples of some of the proposed referendum public access improvement projects and habitat restoration projects. She then reviewed the land preservation goals and ecosystem services examples. Ecosystem services are estimated at \$8,000 per restored acre. For informational purposes Director Snyder showed an example of the referendum to include \$90 million for projects and habitat restoration and \$65 - \$165 million for land preservation. With a potential total referendum amount ranging between \$155 million and \$255 million.

In closing, Director Snyder provided next steps in the process. November 2024 would be the first of three planned referenda in a 10-year period. The District will introduce state legislation to amend the Downstate Forest Preserve Act to increase the maximum tax rate. The effort to amend the Act can take place at the same as the referendum process, but they are not directly connected.

9.2 <u>Presentation on the Spring Legislative Session and Preview of the Fall Legislative Session.</u>
Legislative consultant Derek Blaida provided an update on the State budget, the current legislative session, and the upcoming fall session.

Chair Hart thanked everyone for attending and asked the State Legislators or their staff present to introduce themselves. The following stood up to introduce themselves:
