## BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS LAKE COUNTY FOREST PRESERVE DISTRICT - REGULAR JULY MEETING MINUTES JULY 10, 2019

The Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District met on Tuesday, July 10, 2019 at Lakewood Forest Preserve, Shelter E, Wauconda, Illinois.

- 1.0 Call to Order President Angelo Kyle called the meeting to order at 10:36 am.
- **2.0** Roll Call of Commissioners Secretary Gragnani called the roll and 16 Commissioners answered present: Barr, Carlson, Clark, Danforth, Didech, Durkin, Frank, Kyle, Maine, Martini, Pedersen, Simpson, Taylor, Vealitzek, Wasik, and Wilke. Commissioner Hart arrived after roll call at 10:43 am; Commissioner Hewitt arrived after roll call at 10:45 am. Absent: Cunningham, Paxton, Rummel.
