Dig If You Will

The week begins with an introduction to the site, the Bonner family, and what Lake County was like in the mid-1800s when the Bonners first acquired the property. We will also learn more about seeds as we dig and plant in our garden.

Wednesday

How Does a Garden Grow?

Today we will look at the Bonner family within the surrounding community by examining materials from the Dunn Museum collection. We will examine the science behind the operations of the farm, how the seasons of the year affect growing seasons, and food preservation.

Thursday

And Field to Fork

How does food get from the farm to our tables then versus today? We will learn about farming equipment then and now as we see how the farm changed for the Bonners over time, take a closer look at gardens that are healthy for us and the planet, and more.
