RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval of an Ordinance approving a Restoration Project and License Agreement with Openlands for restoration activities at Almond Marsh Forest Preserve.

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS SUPPORTED: Conservation; Leadership; Organizational Sustainability

FINANCIAL DATA: There are no financial impacts to the District

BACKGROUND: Earlier this year, Openlands contacted District staff regarding the potential to collaborate on the restoration of portions of Almond Marsh Forest Preserve that are dedicated as Illinois Nature Preserve and Illinois Land and Water Reserve. They have proposed joint volunteer efforts to amplify the work of the District and are exploring opportunities, such as Illinois Department of Natural Resources grants, to potentially provide funding to assist with restoration efforts at the site.

The proposed agreement provides a framework for these cooperative activities and authorizes Openlands and its volunteers to perform certain restoration work at Almond Marsh in coordination with the District. Openlands volunteers who work on District property will be required to complete the District's standard volunteer orientation and training programs and follow District instructions, protocols, and safety requirements. District staff will coordinate and oversee all volunteer work on District property.

**AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A RESTORATION PROJECT
AND LICENSE AGREEMENT WITH OPENLANDS**

WHEREAS, the Lake County Forest Preserve District's ("District") mission includes: "*To preserve a dynamic and unique system of natural and cultural resources...*"; and

WHEREAS, Openlands is a not-for-profit organization committed to protecting natural habitats, wildlife, and open spaces of northeastern Illinois and the surrounding region; and

WHEREAS, the District is the owner of certain property commonly known as Almond Marsh Forest Preserve ("Almond Marsh"); and

WHEREAS, the District and Openlands desire to work cooperatively to advance certain restoration and management activities at Almond Marsh, including through mutual collaboration and coordination to amplify volunteer stewardship and coordinate restoration and recovery initiatives; and

WHEREAS, for such purposes, it is in the District's best interest to enter into a Restoration Project and License Agreement with Openlands in substantially the form attached hereto (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7b of the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act (70 ILCS 805/7b), the District is authorized to issue licenses for any activity reasonably connected with the purpose for which the District was created; and

WHEREAS, the restoration, recovery, coordination, and other activities provided for in the Agreement are reasonably connected with the purposes for which the District was created;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District, Lake County, Illinois, **THAT:**

Section 1: Recitals. The recitals set forth above are incorporated as a part of this Ordinance by this reference.

Section 2: Approval of the Agreement. The Agreement, in substantially the form attached hereto as Attachment A and in a final form to be approved by the Executive Director, is hereby approved. The Executive Director of the District is hereby authorized and directed to execute the final form of the Agreement.

Section 3: Work. The Director of Natural Resources of the District or their designee is hereby authorized to coordinate work under the Agreement, in accordance with the Agreement's terms.

Section 4: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

RESTORATION PROJECT AND LICENSE AGREEMENT

By and Between the

**LAKE COUNTY FOREST PRESERVE DISTRICT
and
OPENLANDS**

(Restoration Activities at Almond Marsh Forest Preserve)

THIS RESTORATION PROJECT AND LICENSE AGREEMENT (“Agreement”) is made and entered into as of the 9th day of September, 2026 by and between the Lake County Forest Preserve District (“LCFPD”), and Openlands, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation. LCFPD and Openlands are sometimes referred to collectively herein as the “Parties” and individually as a “Party”.

WHEREAS, the Parties affirm that natural areas in Lake County are faced with a common set of conservation threats including, but not limited to: alteration of hydrologic regimes, fragmentation, establishment and spread of invasive species, altered fire regimes, barriers to migration and movement of fish and wildlife, and herbivore pressures upon native plant communities; and

WHEREAS, it is the mission of the Parties to preserve, protect, restore, and maintain the ecological values of natural areas and in furtherance of these objectives to undertake programs and activities such as biological and physical inventory, scientific research, habitat and wildlife management; and

WHEREAS, LCFPD is the owner of certain property commonly known as Almond Marsh Forest Preserve, which is generally depicted on **Exhibit A** hereto (“Almond Marsh”); and

WHEREAS, Openlands is a not-for-profit organization committed to protecting natural habitats, wildlife, and open spaces of northeastern Illinois and the surrounding region; and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that the long-term health of Almond Marsh depends upon perpetual stewardship, which will be advanced by the Parties’ close cooperation in pursuing a shared long-term vision and ongoing stewardship activities; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are mutually interested in amplifying their Stewardship Volunteer Programs by recruiting and enabling volunteers to contribute to meeting site stewardship goals at Almond Marsh; and

WHEREAS, the restoration and management of Almond Marsh may require proper use of fire management, including prescribed burning, brush pile burning and fire suppression, in a manner that considers natural resource needs, control of invasive species, mitigation of herbivore

pressures, reintroduction of extirpated species, augmentation of species and reconnection of core habitat areas; and

WHEREAS, the LCFPD and Openlands have expertise in restoration and management activities including fire management and prescribed burning, and currently employ or have volunteer personnel and equipment capable of performing fire management activities; and

WHEREAS, the Parties to this Agreement are authorized to execute and implement this Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties, intending to cooperate in the management and protection of Almond Marsh, agree as follows;

I. OBJECTIVES

This Agreement is intended to formalize, for the mutual benefit of the Parties, restoration collaboration between the Parties for the protection and management of a portion of Almond Marsh as depicted as the “Collaboration Area” on **Exhibit A** (the “Project Area”), including implementing prescribed burning, invasive plant control, and monitoring. Through this Agreement, the Parties will focus on common threats and, working together, intend to achieve a positive ecological impact on the Almond Marsh ecosystem, that is greater than the impact they could achieve working separately or individually.

Ecological management of Almond Marsh may be more effective and cost efficient if the Parties work together to coordinate management efforts, share resources and information to improve management practices, and work jointly to secure grant funds for management objectives.

II. COOPERATIVE ACTIVITIES

The Parties intend to work cooperatively to achieve the goals outlined above. The Parties may, but are not obligated to, engage in cooperative activities that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- A. Jointly apply for outside funding to help implement common land management and long-term conservation objectives, including for habitat and hydrologic restoration, invasive species control, wildlife monitoring, management and reintroductions, endangered resources management, and watershed-related management and outreach.
- B. Share information on land management techniques and effectiveness relevant to conservation threats and long-term conservation and land management goals.
- C. Share research and monitoring data and findings relevant to conservation threats and long-term conservation and land management goals.
- D. Share personnel and equipment for the performance of any Activity (as defined below).
- E. Enter into additional agreements and contracts, jointly or individually, in

furtherance of the goals outlined above, including agreements to allow the Parties to share and exchange resources, funds, or equipment to implement activities related to abatement of common threats and achievement of common land management and long-term conservation goals.

III. LICENSE

- A. Grant of License: LCFPD hereby grants to Openlands a non-exclusive, revocable license (the “License”) to enter up and use the Project Area solely for the following purposes, in accordance with this Agreement:

1. Mechanical removal of woody invasive plants and treating with herbicides;
2. Mowing, cutting, pulling, and/or treating (with herbicides) herbaceous invasive plants;
3. Seed collection and seed distribution with consent of LCFPD,
4. Conducting surveys, including but not limited to insects, birds, and rare plants;
5. Conducting public outreach efforts (e.g., tours, flyers, work parties);
6. Trash and debris removal; and
7. Fire management, including brush pile burning and assistance with LCFPD-initiated prescribed burns, under the terms of this Agreement

(individually referred to as an “Activity,” and collectively as “Activities”). Openlands may perform Activities within the Project Area utilizing its employees, volunteers, and/or contractors (collectively, “Personnel”), subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

- B. No Property Rights: Openlands hereby accepts the License and acknowledges and agrees that: (i) the License is a contractual right only, is not an interest in real property, and does not touch and concern, or run with, the land, and (ii) Openlands does not and will not have any legal, beneficial, or equitable interest in Almond Marsh or the Project Area itself. Unless sooner terminated by either Party, the License shall remain in effect for the Term of this Agreement (as defined below).
- C. No Obligations: Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as obligating Openlands to assist with, or complete, any specific Activity. However, if Openlands undertakes any Activity within the Project Area, it will do so in compliance with this Agreement. Openlands may, at any time, elect to withdraw its participation from any Activity, at its sole discretion, unless such withdrawal is prohibited by a contract other than this Agreement.
- D. License Conditions: Openlands’ access to and use of the Project Area pursuant to the License is subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Performance of Activities: Openlands and its Personnel shall perform any and all Activities within the Project Area:
 - i. only during dates and hours approved in advance in writing by LCFPD's Executive Director or their designee;
 - ii. in accordance with any and all plans, specifications, instructions, and other guidance specified by LCFPD, including without limitation specifications for maintaining public access to any facilities and public access areas within Almond Marsh during the performance of Activities;
 - iii. in accordance with the management objectives and approach set forth in any applicable management plan as specified by LCFPD;
 - iv. in a good and workmanlike manner, at no cost to LCFPD, and in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including without limitation all laws related to rare plant and animal species, and when applicable, using appropriate avoidance and minimization measures set forth therein, which laws may include, without limitation: Illinois Endangered Species Protection Act (520 ILCS 10/1, et seq.), Illinois Natural Areas Preservation Act (525 ILCS 30/1, et seq.), Interagency Wetland Policy Act of 1989 (20 ILCS 830/1-1, et seq.), and Illinois Pesticide Act (415 ILCS 60/1 et seq.); and
 - v. in compliance with all minimum safety requirements established by LCFPD (Openlands may require its Personnel to comply with additional or stricter safety standards established by Openlands, provided that in the event of a conflict, the safety standards specified by LCPFD will control).
2. Use of Volunteers: If Openlands performs any Activity utilizing volunteer workers, then each volunteer must:
 - i. execute volunteer agreements and waivers in the forms specified by LCFPD before performing any Activity in the Project Area;
 - ii. complete volunteer orientation and training programs as specified and provided by LCFPD, at LCFPD's cost, before performing any Activity in the Project Area;
 - iii. comply with all volunteer instructions, guidelines, and protocols, including volunteer safety requirements, established by LCFPD;
 - iv. comply with all instructions of the Stewardship Ecologist or other volunteer coordinator/ point person designated by LCFPD and/or Openlands during the performance of Activities.
3. Use of Contractors: If Openlands hires any contractor to perform Activities under this Agreement, Openlands shall notify LCFPD in advance and provide the

contractor's name, mailing address, and primary contact (including such person's email address and telephone number). Openlands shall not perform Activities in the Project Area using any contractor that is not acceptable to LCFPD in its sole discretion.

4. Pesticide Use: Anyone applying general-use or restricted-use pesticides ("Pesticides") under this Agreement must comply with Illinois Pesticide Act.
 - i. All use of Pesticides within the Project Area must be coordinated with, and approved in advance by, LCFPD.
 - ii. Openlands Personnel working with Pesticides in the Project Area must be certified by the Illinois Department of Agriculture ("IDAG") as a licensed applicator or operator to apply Pesticides. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if approved by LCFPD, volunteers and interns may be permitted to apply general use (non-restricted) herbicides for control of invasive species without an applicator or operator license, provided they have completed training pursuant to 8 Ill. Adm. Code 250.220 and received certification issued by the IDAG.
 - iii. Openlands Personnel working with *aquatic* Pesticides in the Project Area must be an IDAG-Certified Applicator, *Aquatic* category.
5. Power Equipment/ Chainsaw Use: All use of power equipment, including chainsaws, within the Project Area must be coordinated with LCFPD. All Openlands Personnel working with power equipment shall abide by LCFPD's training, certification, and safety standards and protocols and follow all LCFPD site management procedures.
6. Prescribed Burning and Fire Management:
 - i. *Prescribed Burning*. Any and all prescribed burning (landscape burns) shall be initiated by LCFPD and follow LCFPD policies and procedures. LCFPD staff shall act as "burn boss" for any prescribed burning. Openlands may collaborate with LCFPD in planning prescribed burning and fire management, but Openlands or its Personnel shall not initiate prescribed burns in the Project Area. Any Openlands Personnel participating in prescribed burn Activities initiated by LCFPD must have completed LCFPD Burn Crew Member training (and any other training requirements specified by LCFPD from time to time) and have training certificates on file with LCFPD prior to such participation.
 - ii. *Brush Pile Burning*. Burning of brush as part of any woody invasive species removal Activities shall meet all training and safety standards for employees and contractors of LCFPD and the notification protocols of LCFPD. All Personnel participating in brush pile burning activities must follow the training and protocols established by LCFPD.

7. Responsibility for Personnel: Openlands assumes full responsibility for its Personnel during the performance of any Activities. Openlands must repair any damage to the Project Area or any other property owned by LCFPD caused by the acts or omissions of Openlands or its Personnel or any other agent acting by or on behalf of Openlands.
8. Indemnity: Openlands assumes sole and complete responsibility for any personal injury, including death, and damage to property that may arise directly or indirectly from the use of the Project Area by Openlands, its officers, directors, trustees, board members, partners, employees, agents, contractors, volunteers, guests, and invitees. To the maximum extent permitted by law, Openlands shall indemnify, hold harmless, defend, and release LCFPD, its commissioners, officers, agents, employees, volunteers, guests, and invitees from and against any alleged loss, claim, damage, or expense (including, without limitation, attorneys' fees and litigation costs) that may be alleged or asserted against any of those parties in connection with any act or omission by Openlands related to the use of the Project Area (collectively, the "Indemnified Claims"), whether or not any such act or omission is alleged to result from Openlands' breach of this Agreement, negligence, willful misconduct, or failure to adhere to any other standard of conduct; however, this indemnity will not apply to the extent any Indemnified Claims are caused by the willful misconduct or gross negligence of LCFPD.
9. Insurance: Openlands shall, at no cost or expense to LCFPD, procure and maintain insurance policies acceptable to LCFPD, in its sole discretion, with coverages and limits that LCFPD determines, in its sole judgment, are sufficient to protect the LCFPD, the Project Area, and any other property owned by the LCFPD from risk of loss arising from the Activities to be performed by Openlands or its Personnel (including third-party contractors) and any other agents, including Indemnified Claims. LCFPD shall be named as an additional insured on such policies, and Openlands will provide to LCFPD certificates of insurance acceptable to LCFPD evidencing the insurance required by this section prior to performing any Activity within the Project Area.
10. No Liens: Openlands represents and warrants that it will take all actions necessary to keep the Project Area free and clear of liens, claims, demands, taxes, assessments, or other liabilities, including without limitation mechanic's liens, in connection with the Activities. Openlands shall, at its sole cost and expense: (i) cause any lien that is filed against the Project Area or Almond Marsh as a result of Activities undertaken by or on behalf of Openlands to be discharged and released, and (ii) provide to LCFPD evidence of the discharge and release, in recordable form, within 30 days after the lien was filed.
11. Reservation of Rights: LCFPD reserves the right to use the Project Area and other property owned by LCFPD in any manner and for any purpose determined by LCFPD, including, without limitation: (i) granting other non-exclusive licenses or easements within the Project Area, and (ii) providing for public access to the Project Area for any public purpose. Openlands shall not use the Project Area in any

manner that unreasonably interferes with LCFPD's use and occupancy of its property as set forth herein.

12. Termination for Cause or Convenience: If Openlands breaches any term or provision of this Agreement, and fails to cure such breach within 10 days after receiving written notice from LCFPD of such breach, then LCFPD may terminate and revoke the License and pursue any remedies available at law or in equity. In addition, either Party may terminate the License by providing the other Party written notice of such termination not less than 30 days in advance of the effective date of such termination.

IV. LIAISONS/PROJECT OFFICERS

The Parties have designated the persons below to act as their liaisons for purposes of coordinating Activities and other cooperative efforts under this Agreement. It is anticipated that the liaisons will interact on a regular basis. A Party may change its liaison information at any time by written notice to the other Party.

V. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. Term and Termination: The term of this Agreement (“Term”) shall commence upon its approval and execution by both Parties and continue until the Agreement is terminated as provided herein. Either Party may terminate this Agreement by giving 30 days’ written notice to the other Party. However, the Parties’ obligations under Sections III.D.8, III.D.10, V.B, and V.E shall survive termination of this Agreement.
- B. Record Keeping; Confidentiality of Certain Data: Openlands shall track and record Activities performed within the Project Area using tracking software as specified by LCFPD. Activity records shall include woody invasive plant control, herbaceous plant control, herbicide use and prescribed fire/brush pile burning. Additionally, if Openlands collects any data on rare, threatened, or endangered plant or animal species identified within the Project Area or on LCFPD Property (“Rare Species Data”), Openlands will provide such Rare Species Data to the LCFPD using the specified tracking software. Except with LCFPD’s express written permission, Openlands will not publish or disclose to the public or to any third party any Rare Species Data.
- C. Assignment: Neither Party may assign or transfer its rights and obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party, which consent may be granted or withheld in that Party’s sole discretion.
- D. Personnel: No Party or its officers, employees, contractors, or volunteers will be deemed an employee or agent of the other Party. Each Party is responsible for the salary, wages, benefits, and other costs for its own personnel, including providing workers’ compensation coverage for its employees participating in any Activity under this Agreement to the extent required by law. Unless otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, each Party will provide for and pay its own costs in the performance under this Agreement, including costs for the use of contractors, consultants, and equipment.
- E. Responsibility: Each Party shall be responsible for the consequences of its own acts, errors, or omissions and those of its employees, volunteers, boards, commissions, agencies, officers, and representatives and shall be responsible for any losses, claims, and liabilities which are attributable to such acts, errors, or omissions including providing its own defense. Except as provided in Section III.D.8, in situations including joint liability, each Party shall be responsible for the consequences of its own acts, errors, or omissions and those of its employees, agents, boards, commissions, agencies, officers and representatives. Subject to Openlands’ indemnity obligations under Section III.D.8 (which shall control in

the case of conflict with this paragraph), each Party shall defend and indemnify the other Party against and from claims arising or alleged to arise out of the acts, errors, or omissions of the Party and its employees, volunteers, boards, commissions, agencies, officers, and representatives in the performance of this Agreement. It is not the intent of the Parties to waive any immunity or defense otherwise available.

- F. No Joint Venture: The Parties agree that they are not entering into a legal partnership, joint venture, or other such business arrangement, nor is the purpose of the Parties to enter into a commercial undertaking for monetary gain. No Party shall refer to or treat the arrangements under this Agreement as a legal partnership or take any action inconsistent with such intention.
- G. Other Cooperators: This Agreement does not preclude the Parties from establishing similar agreements and/or contracts with other individuals, corporations, agencies, and public or private organizations. The Parties recognize the importance of continuing to cooperate and work with others in programs of mutual interest.
- H. Compliance with Laws: The Parties will comply with all the applicable laws and regulations during the performance of this Agreement.
- I. Governing Law; Venue: This Agreement will be governed by, enforced by, and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to the conflicts of law rules thereof. The venue for any dispute under this Agreement shall be the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit (Lake County) Illinois.
- J. Notice: Each notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed received by the addressee thereof: (i) when delivered in person on a business day to the street address set forth below; (ii) when transmitted by email on a business day to the email address below, or on the next business day if transmitted on a non-business day or after the addressee's regular business hours, (iii) on the first business day after it is deposited with a nationally recognized overnight delivery service addressed to the street address below, or (iv) on the third business day after it is deposited with the United States postal service, addressed to the street address below, first class postage prepaid.

By notice complying with the requirements of this section, either Party may change the address or addressee for all future notices to it, but no notice of a change of address or addressee shall be effective until actually received. Nothing in this Section will be deemed to invalidate a notice that is actually received by a Party.

- K. Severability: If any provision of this Agreement shall be adjudged to be unlawful or contrary to public policy, then that provision shall be deemed null and void and severable from the remaining provisions, and shall in no way affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.
- L. Waiver: Failure or delay on the part of any Party to exercise any right, power, privilege or remedy hereunder shall not constitute a waiver thereof. A waiver of any default shall not operate as a waiver of any other default or of the same type of default on a future occasion.
- M. Amendments: This Agreement may be reviewed by the Parties as necessary, but no amendment shall be effective unless agreed to in writing by both Parties.
- N. No Personal Liability: No employee, officer, elected or appointed official or agent of a Party shall be individually or personally liable in connection with this Agreement.
- O. Entire Agreement: This Agreement, including exhibits, embodies the entire and complete agreement and understanding between the Parties and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous communications and negotiations, both oral and written, and constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties relating to the subject matter hereof.
- P. Electronic Signatures; Counterparts: This Agreement may be executed electronically and/or in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original.

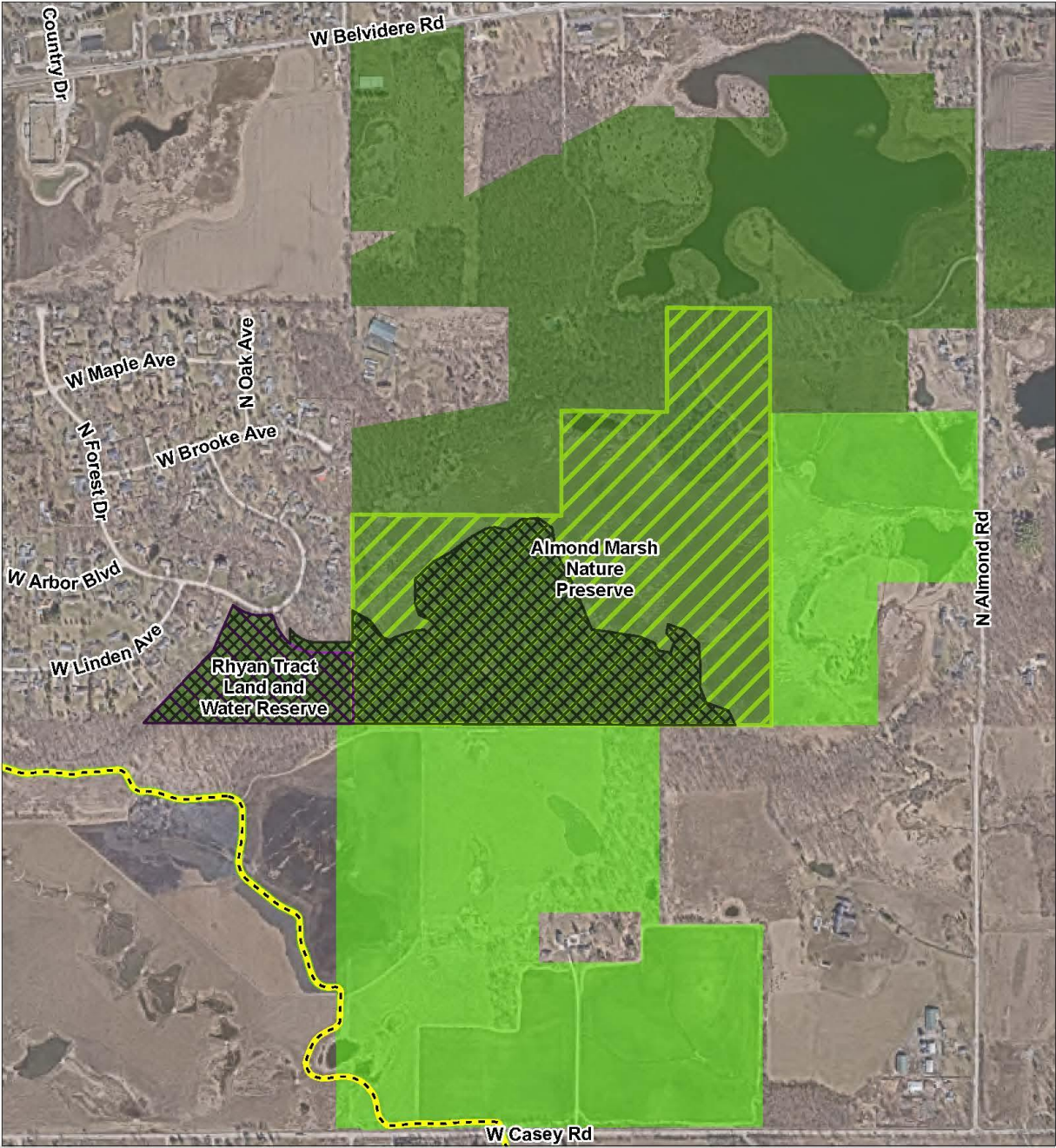
