(including a Shared-Use Path and Relocated Entrance) along IL Route 132 between Duck

Farm and Fourth Lake Forest Preserves and Future Land Conveyances

RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval of a Resolution approving an Intergovernmental Agreement with Illinois Department of Transportation to provide a shared-use path along IL Route 132 between Duck Farm and Fourth Lake Forest Preserves and a relocated vehicle entrance to the Duck Farm Dog Exercise Area.

BACKGROUND: In January 2015, the Land Preservation & Acquisition, Planning & Restoration and Finance & Administrative Committees authorized staff to negotiate an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to include the construction of a shared-use path along Illinois Route 132 (Grand Avenue) and to relocate the existing Duck Farm Dog Exercise Area vehicular entrance as part of IDOT's road improvement contract.

As part of the planned improvements, IDOT will construct an eight foot wide shared use path on the north side and a five foot wide concrete sidewalk on the south side of Route 132 between the Duck Farm and Fourth Lake Forest Preserves.

The attached resolution approves an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) that sets forth IDOT's and the District's relative cost-sharing and maintenance obligations regarding the Duck Farm entrance relocation and the shared use path. The IGA will allow the District to connect two forest preserves, provide convenient access for hundreds of residents to the Millennium Trail and provide a safer vehicular entrance to the Duck Farm Dog Exercise Area.

District staff expects that, in the future and in conjunction with this project, IDOT will request that the District convey to IDOT:

- > 0.20 acre of District property at Duck Farm Forest Preserve through permanent easement for traffic signal equipment and the proposed sidewalk.
- > 0.06 acre of temporary easement at Duck Farm Forest Preserve for grading to meet existing grades.
- > 0.4 acre of donated temporary easement at Duck Farm Forest Preserve to relocate and construct the new entrance to align with the Munn Road intersection.
- > 0.1 acre of District property at Fourth Lake Forest Preserve through permanent easement for the proposed shared-use path.

The attached resolution authorizes the District President and her designees to approve these future conveyances. Staff also recommends that the District design and construct the trail connection from the south end of the proposed shared use path to the existing fire lane/trail head within Fourth Lake Forest Preserve.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: Committee recommendation and Board approval are required in accordance with District policy.

REVIEW BY OTHERS: Chief Operations Officer, Director of Finance, Legal Counsel

FINANCIAL DATA: By including the work now as part of IDOT's road improvement project, the District's share will be 20% of the total engineering and construction costs for a portion of the shared-use path (from the Lindenhurst village limit to the entrance to Fourth Lake Forest Preserve). The District will pay 100% of the cost of the Duck Farm Forest Preserve vehicular entrance relocation. The District will be responsible for the maintenance of the shared-use path along the frontage of Fourth Lake Forest Preserve. This project was approved as part of the adopted FY 2015/2016 Capital Improvement Plan in the amount of \$100,000.00. The District's share is estimated at \$25,990.00 and will be charged to account 35634100-803200-60301.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR IMPROVEMENTS ALONG ILLINOIS ROUTE 132 NEAR DUCK FARM AND FOURTH LAKE FOREST PRESERVES, AND APPROVING FUTURE LAND CONVEYANCES

WHEREAS, the Lake County Forest Preserve District (the "District") owns properties adjacent to IL Route 132 in and near Lindenhurst, Lake County, Illinois, known as the Duck Farm Forest Preserve and the Fourth Lake Forest Preserve; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Transportation (the "IDOT") has statutory responsibility for the planning, construction, operation and maintenance of the State of Illinois' highways, including IL Route 132; and

WHEREAS, the District has issues of common interest with IDOT to provide a safe means of travel for pedestrians and cyclists along State highways; and

WHEREAS, IDOT has proposed road improvements to IL Route 132 that include widening and resurfacing Route 132 from Munn Rod to Deerpath Drive, related median, traffic signal, and storm sewer improvements, and a shared-use path and sidewalk extending from the Duck Farm Forest Preserve to the District's Millennium Trail at Fourth Lake Forest Preserve (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the District and IDOT desire to improve the safety of the existing vehicle entrance (the "Entrance") to the Duck Farm Forest Preserve by relocating the Entrance so that it aligns with the traffic signalized intersection of Munn Road; and

WHEREAS, an Intergovernmental Agreement between the District and IDOT (the "Agreement") will allow for cost-sharing for and future maintenance of the Project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement, the District would pay a local share of 20% of a portion of the shared-use path and 100% of the engineering and construction costs for relocating the Entrance, which shares are currently estimated to total \$25,990.00 (the "Local Share"); and

WHEREAS, in conjunction with the Project, IDOT will request that the District convey to IDOT the following real property rights in the following portions of District land:

- (i) a permanent easement in 0.20 acre of Duck Farm Forest Preserve traffic signal equipment and the proposed sidewalk,
- (ii) a temporary easement in 0.06 acre of Duck Farm Forest Preserve for grading to meet existing grades,
- (iii) a donated temporary easement in 0.4 acre of Duck Farm Forest Preserve to relocate and construct the Entrance, and
- (iv) a permanent easement in 0.1 acre of Fourth Lake Forest Preserve for the proposed shared-use path (collectively, the "Future Conveyances"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, units of local government, such as the District and IDOT may contract or otherwise associate among themselves in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., any power, privilege, function, or authority exercised by a public agency, including the District and IDOT, may be exercised, combined, transferred, and enjoyed jointly with any other public agency to the extent not prohibited by law;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Government Property Transfer Act, 50 ILCS 605/1 et seq. the District is authorized to make the Land Conveyances to IDOT; and

WHEREAS, it is in the District's best interest to enter into the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District, Lake County, Illinois THAT:

Section 1. Recitals. The recitals set forth above are incorporated as a part of this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. Approval of the Agreement. The Agreement is hereby approved in substantially the form attached hereto. The President, Executive Director and Secretary are authorized and directed to execute on behalf of the District the Agreement, in substantially the form attached hereto, and whatever other documents are necessary to effectuate such Agreement. Without limiting the remainder of this Section, the District Treasurer is authorized to pay the Local Share to IDOT.

Section 3. Approval of Land Conveyances. The District President is hereby authorized to approve and execute plats of dedication, plats of easement, deeds, agreements, and any other documents necessary to make the Land Conveyances to IDOT, and to cause other District officers and employees to approve and execute such documents, after such documents have been reviewed and approved by the District's Corporate Counsel.

<u>Section 3</u>. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the STATE in order to facilitate the free flow of traffic and ensure safety to the motoring public, is desirous of improving approximately 10,632 lineal feet of FAP Route 541, Illinois Route 132 (Grand Avenue), STATE Section A-TS-2 (12), STATE Job No.: C-91-004-13, State Contract Number 60V55 by widening and resurfacing from Munn Road to Deerpath Drive, providing two 12 foot through traffic lanes in each direction, a 16 foot raised median with variable width left turn lanes, modernizing traffic signals at the Illinois Route 132 intersections with Munn Road, Granada Boulevard/Lindenhurst Drive and Sand Lake Road, constructing new 5 foot wide concrete sidewalk, constructing new 8 foot wide hot-mix asphalt shared use paths, improving the storm sewer system for highway drainage and by performing all other work necessary to complete the improvement in accordance with the approved plans and specifications; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT requests that the STATE include in its contract relocation of the Duck Farm Forest Preserve Entrance, as generally depicted on the attached Exhibit A, and a shared use path extension from the Lindenhurst village limit to the Fourth Lake Forest Preserve Entrance; as generally depicted on the attached Exhibit B, and

WHEREAS, the STATE has agreed to the DISTRICT's request; and

WHEREAS, the DISTRICT is desirous of said improvement in that same will be of immediate benefit to the DISTRICT residents and permanent in nature;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The STATE agrees to make the surveys, obtain all necessary rights of way, prepare plans and specifications, receive bids and award the contract, furnish engineering inspection during construction and cause the improvement to be built in accordance with the approved plans, specifications and contract.
- 2. The STATE agrees to pay for all right of way, construction and engineering cost subject to reimbursement by the DISTRICT as hereinafter stipulated.
- 3. It is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the estimated cost and cost proration for this improvement is as shown on Exhibit C attached hereto and made a part hereof.

4. The DISTRICT has passed an annual appropriations ordinance that appropriates sufficient funds to pay its share of the cost for this improvement, estimated to be Twenty Five Thousand Ninme Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$25,990.00), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit D and made a part hereof.

The DISTRICT further agrees, that upon award of the contract for this improvement, the DISTRICT will pay to the STATE in a lump sum from any funds allotted to the DISTRICT an amount equal to 80% of its obligation incurred under this AGREEMENT, and will pay to said STATE the remainder of the obligation (including any non-participating costs on FA Projects) in a lump sum, upon completion of the project, based upon final costs.

- 5. Upon final field inspection of the improvement and so long as Illinois Route 132 is used as a STATE Highway, the STATE agrees to maintain or cause to be maintained the median, the through traffic lanes, the left-turn lanes and right turn lanes, and the curb and gutter, stabilized shoulders and ditches adjacent to those traffic lanes and turn lanes.
- 6. The DISTRICT agrees to continue its existing maintenance responsibilities on all entrance approaches within Duck Farm Forest Preserve and Fourth Lake Forest Preserve under its jurisdiction, including all left and right turn lanes on said driveway approaches, up to the through edge of pavement of Illinois Route 132. Drainage facilities, if any, at the aforementioned driveways located within the STATE right-of-way shall be the joint maintenance responsibility of the STATE and the DISTRICT unless there is an agreement specifying different responsibilities.

7. The DISTRICT agrees to assume responsibility for the administration, control, reconstruction and maintenance of the shared use path from the Lindenhurst village limit to the Fourth Lake Forest Preserve Entrance. The DISTRICT further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State, its officers, employees, and agents from any and all claims, lawsuits, actions, costs, and fees (including reasonable attorney fees and expenses) of every nature and description arising from, growing out of, or connected with any claim that the DISTRICT negligently operated or operated said shared use path, to the full extent of the DISTRICT's additional insured insurance coverage.

If in the future, the STATE adopts a roadway or traffic signal improvement on Illinois Route 132 which requires modification, relocation or reconstruction to said shared use path, then the DISTRICT hereby agrees to be financially responsible for its proportionate share of costs to modify, relocate or reconstruct said shared use path in conjunction with the STATE's improvement.

8. The DISTRICT has authorized or will authorize a DISTRICT representative to sign the Plan Approval page which is part of this document, prior to the STATE advertising for the work to be performed hereunder, approving the plans and specifications as prepared. 9. Under penalties of perjury, the DISTRICT certifies that its correct Federal Tax Identification number is 36-6009339 and it is doing business as a GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, whose mailing address is:

Obligations of the STATE and the DISTRICT will cease immediately without penalty or further payment being required if, in any fiscal year, the Illinois General Assembly or Federal funding source fails to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for this contract.

This AGREEMENT and the covenants contained herein shall be null and void in the event the contract covering the construction work contemplated herein is not awarded within the three years subsequent to execution of the agreement.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and to the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.







SUBJECT: Annual Appropriation Ordinance for Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2016

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Adopt the Annual Appropriation Ordinance for Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2016, in the amount of \$115,660,000.

BACKGROUND: On May 4, 2015, the budget for Fiscal Year 2015/16 in the amount of \$80,474,020 will be presented to the Board for adoption. The proposed Appropriation Ordinance represents the second step in the process to accomplish the requirements of the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act 70 ILCS 805/13.3. The third step, The Tax Levy Ordinance, will be presented to the Board for approval prior to December 2, 2015.

The Annual Appropriation Ordinance provides the authority to expend funds for salaries and benefits, commodities, contractuals, and capital outlays as may be required. The Ordinance proposes an appropriation of \$115,660,000 which includes:

The appropriation establishes the maximum total amounts authorized to be expended for various purposes and does not create a commitment on behalf of the District.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: In accordance with the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act and the Lake County Forest Preserves "Rules of Order and Operational Procedures" adopted December 9, 2014, adoption of an Annual Appropriation Ordinance is required.

ORDINANCE SETTING FORTH THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR LAKE COUNTY FOREST PRESERVE DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016 (JULY 1, 2015 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2016)

WHEREAS, on May 12, 2015, the Lake County Forest Preserve District Board of Commissioners adopted the Annual Budget Ordinance for the Fiscal Year 2015/16; and

WHEREAS, the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act (70 ILCS 805/13.3), and the Lake County Forest Preserve District's "Rules of Order and Operational Procedures" adopted December 9, 2014, require that an Annual Appropriation Ordinance be adopted by the Lake County Forest Preserve District Board of Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District, Lake County, Illinois, THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. <u>Recitals</u>. The recitals set forth above are incorporated as a part of this Ordinance by this reference.

Section 2. Appropriations. The following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, are or may be required to defray all necessary expenses and liabilities of the Lake County Forest Preserve District, and the same shall be, and they are hereby, appropriated for the objects and purposes hereinafter specified for the 2016 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016:

Section 3. Legal Effect. The appropriations made pursuant to Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be construed only as establishing the maximum total amounts authorized to be expended for the various objects and purposes stated in said Section and no such appropriation shall be construed to be, or to create, a commitment, agreement, obligation or liability of the Lake County Forest Preserve District nor shall any such appropriation authorize any expenditure of funds without, in each case, the approval of such expenditure by the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District or by such other person or entity authorized by applicable law.

Section 4. Unexpended Prior Appropriations. Pursuant to the Downstate Forest Preserve District Act (70 ILCS 805/13.2), any prior appropriation for the purpose of constructing, restoring, reconditioning, reconstructing, or acquiring improvements in the development of forests and lands of the District that has not yet been expended, shall not lapse and any sum of money levied, collected or received for that purpose shall be held for at least five years after its appropriation, to be used for the purpose for which it was appropriated. Any other sum of money appropriated, levied, collected or received for any object or purpose, but not yet expended, is hereby re-appropriated by this Ordinance for such object or purpose.

Section 5. Severability. If any appropriation made by, or any provision of, this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court or by any administrative body or official, such decision shall not affect the validity of any other appropriation made by, or any other provision of, this Ordinance.

Section 6. Filing with County Clerk. Pursuant to Section 18-50 of the Illinois Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/18-50), the District Treasurer is hereby directed to execute the certification attached to this Ordinance and the District Secretary is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the County Clerk of Lake County, Illinois within 30 days after its passage and approval.

Section 7. Effective Date; Publication. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by a concurrence of a majority of all the members constituting the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District and shall be published in pamphlet form within 10 days after its passage and approval.
