

#### **Major Gifts Received**



#### Adopt a Turtle Program

Four-year-old Anya became our youngest turtle supporter. On August 10, her grandmother brought her to the General Offices to donate her life savings - \$21 "for the turtles."

As of August 17, \$13,338 has been raised, exceeding our \$12,000 goal. We are still welcoming donations and new Turtle Champions, with all of the proceeds supporting the Turtle Recovery Program.
