RECOMMENDATION: Approve the award of one farm license at Ray Lake Forest Preserve to the highest qualified bidder.

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS SUPPORTED: Conservation; Organizational Sustainability

FINANCIAL DATA: This farm license will generate \$17,759.70 annually, and will be credited to the Farmland Management Fund (28642500-403000).

BACKGROUND: The farming program is conducted with local farmers to provide cost-effective, interim land use and management until the District is ready to convert farmland to other forest preserve purposes. The current assumed lease agreements covering Ray Lake Forest Preserve will expire on December 31, 2017. The farm license was advertised in the News-Sun and bid packages were available on the District's website. The license was advertised for a 2-year term. Three potential Licensees submitted bids. The highest qualified bidder for the parcel is noted below:
