**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the award of one farm license at Lake Marie Forest Preserve to the highest qualified bidder.

**STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS SUPPORTED:** Conservation; Organizational Sustainability

**FINANCIAL DATA:** Awarding the license will generate \$32,722.56 annually, and will be credited to the Farmland Management Fund (28642500-403000). Revenue generated from this land in 2017 was \$35,632.98.

**BACKGROUND:** The farming program is conducted with local farmers to provide cost-effective, interim land use and management until the District is ready to convert farmland to other forest preserve purposes. The previous farm license at Lake Marie was terminated pursuant to direction received at the November Operations Committee meeting. The farm license was advertised in the News-Sun and bid packages were available on the District's website. The license was advertised for a 2-year term, starting January 1, 2018. Four potential Licensees submitted bids. The highest qualified bidder for the parcel is noted below:
