**SUBJECT:** Native Seed Purchase for Captain Daniel Wright Woods, Cuba Marsh and Kestrel Ridge Forest Preserves Habitat Restoration Projects.

RECOMMENDATION: Recommend approval of a Resolution awarding a Contract for the Purchase of Native Seed for Captain Daniel Wright Woods, Cuba Marsh, and Kestrel Ridge Forest Preserves to Prairie Moon Nursery, Winona, Minnesota, in the Contract Price of \$75,677.23 and Shooting Star Native Seeds, Spring Grove, Minnesota in the Contract Price of \$37,323.98.

BACKGROUND: Captain Daniel Wright Woods is an integral part of the Southern Des Plaines River Woodland Restorations Project. The project's goal is to enhance the diverse biological resources of the preserve, individually and connectively, as a woodland system along the Des Plaines River corridor in Lake County. Preserves within this project area also include MacArthur Woods Forest Preserves, Grainger Woods Conservation Preserve and Ryerson Conservation Area. Major initiatives of this project focus on stabilizing the woodland structure, restoring age and size class distribution of the native trees, restoring historic hydrology, replacing invasive species with native forbs, grasses, trees and shrubs, and reintroducing native wildlife.

Invasive woody species control was recently completed within a 100- acre portion of Cuba Marsh Forest Preserve. This seed purchase is for the restored woodland and prairie areas. And lastly, 10 acres of a recently retired agriculture field at Kestrel Ridge Forest Preserve is being restored to prairie habitat by this seeding effort.

These seed purchase contracts will provide over 75 species of grass and forbs used for approximately 120 acres of woodland and prairie planting at 3 Preserves.

The project was advertised on February 3, 2015 and five bids were received. A summary of the lowest bids received is listed below:

Materials were bid on a unit price per species. Staff has awarded a contract to each of the 2 low bidders whose total bids are less than \$20,000.00. Staff recommends that Prairie Moon Nursery and Shooting Star Native Seeds be awarded contracts as the lowest responsible bidders for the species for which they are the low bidders. Work is anticipated to begin December 2015 and be completed by February 2016.

**REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:** Committee recommendation and Board approval are required in accordance with District policy.

FINANCIAL DATA: These projects were approved as part of the adopted FY 2014/2015 Capital Improvement Plan in the amount of \$119,454.95. The 2 vendors with bids under \$20,000.00 that do not require Committee and Board approval total \$6,453.74, and combine with these contracts for a grand total \$119,454.95, which will be charged to accounts shown below. This portion of the project was estimated at \$125,000.

# A RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF NATIVE SEED FOR THE SOUTHERN DES PLAINES PRESERVES, CAPTAIN DANIEL WRIGHT WOODS, KESTREL RIDGE AND CUBA MARSH HABITAT RESTORATION PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the Lake County Forest Preserve District (the "District") has advertised in <u>The News Sun</u> for sealed bids to purchase native seed for the Southern Des Plaines Preserves, Captain Daniel Wright Woods, Kestrel Ridge and Cuba Marsh Habitat Restoration Projects (the "Products"); and

WHEREAS, all sealed bids were received and opened by the District at its General Offices, 1899 West Winchester Road, Libertyville, Illinois on February 17, 2015 at 10:00 a.m.; and

WHEREAS, the District's staff; the Purchasing Manager; the Director of Natural Resources; the Planning and Restoration Committee; and the Finance and Administrative Committee have reviewed the bids identified on Exhibit A and recommend that the Board of Commissioners find (i) Prairie Moon Nursery, Winona, Minnesota, to be the lowest responsible bidder with respect to the bids on Exhibit A in the column labeled "Prairie Moon Nursery" ("Prairie Moon Bids") and (ii) Shooting Star Native Seeds, Spring Grove, Minnesota, to be the lowest responsible bidder with respect to the bids on Exhibit A in the column labeled "Shooting Star Native Seeds" ("Shooting Star Bids"), and award contracts for the Products to those bidders consistent therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners hereby finds that Prairie Moon Nursery and Shooting Star Native Seeds are the lowest responsible bidders for the Products, as set forth in the previous clause;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Lake County Forest Preserve District, Lake County, Illinois, **THAT**:

Section 1: Recitals. The recitals set forth above are incorporated as part of this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2: Award of Contract. The Prairie Moon Bids in the total amount of \$75,677.23 ("Prairie Moon Contract Price") are hereby accepted and a contract for the Products in the amount of the Prairie Moon Contract Price is hereby awarded to Prairie Moon Nursery. The Shooting Star Bids in the total amount of \$37,323.98 ("Shooting Star Contract Price") are hereby accepted and a contract for the Products in the amount of the Shooting Star Contract Price is hereby awarded to Shooting Star Native Seeds, (collectively the "Contracts").

<u>Section 3:</u> <u>Execution of Contracts.</u> The Executive Director of the District is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Contracts in the amounts of the Shooting Star Contract Price and the Prairie Moon Contract Price.

<u>Section 4: Payments.</u> The District Treasurer shall make payments under the Contracts only pursuant to and in accordance with the Contracts' terms.

Section 5: Effective Date. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.
